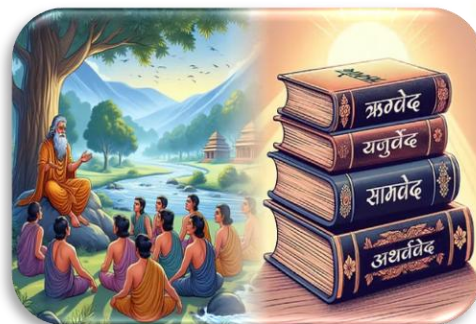

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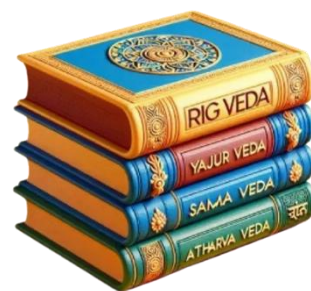

P.G.D.A.V. College (Eve.)

Pannalal Girdharlal Dayanand Anglo-Vedic (PGDAV) College (Eve.), founded in 1958 by DAV College Managing Committee, is a co-educational, NAAC-accredited institution. It draws high traditions of excellence and learning from two eminent institutions of higher education in India viz. the University of Delhi and the DAV Education Trust- the world's largest NGO in the field of education with over 900 schools, colleges and universities in the country and the world.

The College is housed in its own building at Nehru Nagar (near Lajpat Nagar), Ring Road, New Delhi-110065. It has easy and convenient connectivity by bus and metro from all parts of Delhi. The nearest metro station – Vinobapuri – on the pink line is located immediately next to the college premises.

Admissions to the above courses shall be made in a phased Program of the University of Delhi on the basis of merit and the total number of seats available in each course. The College follows the Semester System as per the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework – 2022 based on the National Education Policy 2020.

The guidelines and schedule of admission to be followed for admission to the Undergraduate Programme in the regular Colleges for the academic session 2026-27 are notified by the University of Delhi.

Candidates must appear in CUET (UG) in the following subject combination: Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2. Merit will be based on the CUET (UG) scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

**M. A. (Hindi)**

For admission to M.A. Hindi, the candidates must fulfill the Program Specific Eligibility and appear in the respective CUET (PG) paper. Refer to cuet.nta.nic.in for the syllabus of the CUET (PG) paper.

1A. Bachelor's Degree from a recognized University with at least two (02) Courses in Hindi.

1B. Master's Degree from a recognized University in any of the following: Sanskrit, English, Modern Indian Language (other than Hindi), Linguistics, Sociology, History, Philosophy, Psychology, Political Science, Buddhist studies, Journalism / Mass Communication.

2A. B.A. (Hons) Hindi from University of Delhi.

Eligibility Requirements for Undergraduate Admissions

Common Minimum Eligibility*

The candidate must have passed the Class XII or its equivalent examination from single recognized board.

*For the purpose of ascertaining the Minimum Eligibility, the marksheet/ degree of only one board will be considered. (For example, if a candidate has appeared in CBSE Board Examination with five subjects except for Mathematics and later appears and passes Mathematics from another board such as the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), the minimum eligibility shall be ascertained from his/her mark sheet issued by CBSE only).

University Guidelines for Admission to various Undergraduate Programmes for the Academic Session 2026-27

- The candidate must be a citizen of India.
- For admission to Undergraduate Programmes of the University of Delhi, all candidates (including those applying for supernumerary seats) must register for CUET (UG) - 2026 at <https://cuet.nta.nic.in/>. For seat allotment candidates must apply to Common Seat Allocation System (UG) – 2026 of University of Delhi.
- Admissions to all undergraduate (UG) Programmes will be done through a Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS (UG) – 2026).
- To minimise the number of rounds of allocation and to start the academic session timely, the University may explore the possibilities of admitting candidates over and above the sanctioned strength.
- Details related to Allocations and Admission through CSAS (UG) – 2026 etc. will be notified separately.
- The latest and updated information related to undergraduate programmes will be available on the website of the University of Delhi www.admission.uod.ac.in.



Important Points

- Admissions to all Undergraduate Programmes at the University of Delhi will be based on the scores obtained in CUET (UG) – 2026, except for admissions to the School of Open Learning (SOL), Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) and Foreign Nationals.
- An eligible candidate desirous of seeking admission to the Undergraduate Programme(s) of the University of Delhi for the academic session 2026-27 must read the contents of Bulletin of Information, as well as the notifications, updates and information published on the admission website of the University of Delhi very carefully.
- The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII Examination or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
- The candidate must have passed Class XII examination of any Board / University examination in India, or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- **For admission to University of Delhi, it is mandatory for the candidate to appear in CUET (UG) - 2026 in those subjects in which s(he) is appearing/has passed Class XII.**
- In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET (UG) - 2026, the candidate must appear in the Language/Domain Specific subject that is similar/closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII (for example, if a candidate has studied Biochemistry in Class XII, s(he) must appear in Biology in CUET (UG) - 2026).
- Admission will be based only on the combination of scores of Language and/or Domain Specific subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET (UG) – 2026 as per the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.
- Only the scores obtained in CUET (UG) - 2026 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2026-27.
- Candidates must study the Programme-Specific requirements carefully and then appear in Language and/or Domain Specific subjects of the CUET (UG) - 2026.
- The candidate is advised to check that s(he) satisfies all eligibility criteria for the programme(s) for which s(he) is appearing in the entrance test. Admission is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned program of study. In case a candidate does not meet any eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned program and appears in the entrance test, it is at the candidate's own risk and cost. If at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto.
- Before registering for CUET (UG) - 2026, the candidate is advised to carefully read the Bulletin of Information and consult the University of Delhi Act, 1922 and the Statutes. The Ordinances Rules, and Regulations of the University of Delhi, available on the University website, would be binding on him/her.
- Candidates must be careful while filling the CUET (UG) - 2026 form as certain fields such as Name, signature, and photograph of the candidate will be later auto-integrated by University of Delhi from CUET (UG) – 2026. These fields will be non-editable. As per Ordinance-I of University of Delhi, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the undergraduate programmes in the University and its colleges



except in the Programmes where the respective regulatory bodies, such as Medical Council of India (MCI), All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Dental Council of India (DCI), etc. have prescribed the minimum age requirement in their regulations.

- Gap year will not be a bar for the purpose of admission to undergraduate Programmes. However, such candidates must also appear in CUET (UG) - 2026 for admissions in academic year 2026-27.
- The name of the Candidate claiming reservation must match with the Candidate's name as it appears on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates and in CUET (UG) - 2026. Similarly, the parents' names must also match in the certificates.

Registration and Admission to Postgraduate Programmes for the Academic Session 2026-27

- The candidate must be a citizen of India.
- For admission to Postgraduate Programmes of the University of Delhi, all candidates (including those applying for supernumerary seats) must register for CUET (PG) - 2026 at <https://exams.nta.ac.in/CUET-PG/>. For seat allotment candidates must apply to the Common Seat Allocation System – 2026 of the University of Delhi.
- Admissions to all Postgraduate Programmes will be done through a Common Seat Allocation System CSAS (PG) – 2026.

Minimum Eligibility

- For candidates belonging to UR/OBC-NCL/EWS category, the minimum eligibility is 50% marks aggregate or equivalent grade in the qualifying examination as per the Program-Specific Eligibility.
- For candidates belonging to SC/ST/PwBD category, the minimum eligibility is 45% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade in the qualifying examination as per the Program-Specific Eligibility.

Important Points

1. Admissions to all Postgraduate Programmes at the University of Delhi (UoD) will be based on the scores obtained in Common University Entrance Test (PG) – 2026.
2. Candidates seeking admission to School of Open Learning (SOL) must visit www.sol.du.ac.in
3. Foreign Nationals seeking admission to UoD must register at <https://fsr.du.ac.in/>
4. Before registering for CUET (PG) - 2026, the candidate is advised to read the Bulletin of Information (BOI) carefully and consult the University of Delhi Act, 1922 and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules, and Regulations of the UoD, available on the University website, would be binding on him/her.
5. Candidates are advised to ascertain that they fulfill the Minimum Eligibility Criteria.
6. Candidates appearing in the qualifying degree examination are also eligible to appear in CUET (PG) – 2026. However, they must fulfill the Minimum Eligibility Criteria at the time of admission.
7. Before appearing in CUET (PG) – 2026, candidates must ensure that they fulfill the Program-Specific Eligibility. They must appear in the CUET (UG) paper as per the requirements of the specific Program. For the syllabus of the CUET paper, refer to www.cuet.nta.nic.in.
8. Only the scores obtained in CUET - 2026 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2026-27.



9. Merit will be based solely on the scores obtained in the CUET (UG) Test Paper (except for Programmes where Audition Test/Sports Proficiency Test etc. are mandatory) as per the requirement of the specific program.
10. Candidates are advised to check that they satisfy all eligibility criteria for the program(s) for which they are appearing in the entrance test. Admission is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the eligibility requirements prescribed for the concerned program. In case a candidate does not meet any of the eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned program and appears in the entrance test, it is at the candidate's own risk and cost. If at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirement/s is/are not fulfilled, and/or if the claim/s made by the candidate with respect to his/her category, gender, etc. are found to be invalid, the admission, if granted, shall be cancelled *ipso facto*. Appropriate legal action will be taken against such a candidate.
11. Candidates desirous of seeking admission to UoD will also have to apply to UoD's Common Seat Allocation System (PG) – 2026 (CSAS (PG) – 2026).
12. Candidate must be careful while filling the CUET (PG) – 2026 form as certain fields such as Name, signature, and photograph of the candidate will be later auto-integrated by University of Delhi from the CUET (PG) – 2026 portal. These fields will be non-editable in the UoD's Common Seat Allocation System (PG) - 2026.
13. For the purpose of allocation, all candidates will be considered in the common merit list. However, for Category 2 only students of UoD will be considered as per Program Specific Eligibility.
14. Candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD/CW will have to upload a valid certificate/document while applying to UoD's CSAS (PG) - 2026. The name of the Candidate claiming reservation must match with the Candidate's name as it appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificates and in CUET (PG) - 2026. Similarly, the parents' names must also match with the certificates.
15. Gap year will not be a bar for the purpose of admission to postgraduate Programmes in UoD.
16. As per Ordinance - I of the University, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the Postgraduate Programmes in the University and its colleges except in the Programmes where the respective regulatory bodies, such as Medical Council of India (MCI), All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE), Dental Council of India (DCI), etc. have prescribed the minimum age requirement in their respective regulations.
17. Candidates are advised to regularly check the admission website for any updates and grievances. Any grievance pertaining to candidate's lack of awareness of the published information and updates will not be entertained.

Reservation Policies

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/OBC/EWS Candidates

Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes/ Other Backward Classes and EWS Categories Reservation of seats in admission to various under-graduate Programmes shall be in the following manner:

Scheduled Castes	=	15% of total intake in each course
Scheduled Tribes	=	7.5% of total intake in each course
Other Backward Classes	=	27% of total intake in each course
Economically Weaker Section	=	10% of total intake in each course

Verification of SC/ST/OBC/EWS Certificates:

The admission of the students under reserved category will be confirmed only after final verification/authentication by the respective competent certificate issuing authority. The scrutiny and the admission at the college level are merely provisional.

SC/ST

The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ST Certificate:

- District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Addl. Deputy Commissioner/1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- Chief Presidency Magistrate/Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Applicant and/or his family normally resides.
- Administrator / Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates must note that the SC/ST Certificate from any other person/authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, applicant's caste/tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.

The Caste Certificate should clearly state:

- Name of his/ her caste/ tribe
- whether applicant belongs to SC or ST
- District and the State or Union Territory of applicant's usual place of residence, and
- the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

At the time of admission, the candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate. However, if an SC/ST Applicant seeks admission under some other category (for example: PwD/Employee Ward, etc.) the applicant should satisfy the minimum eligibility requirement for that particular category.

Note: SC/ST Category applicants who get admission under open merit (Unreserved) shall not be included in the reserve quota, i.e. 22.5% (15% for SC and 7.5% for ST).



OBC

The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and **whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only**, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The certificate should be issued on or after 31st March, 2026.

EWS

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019/ 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10 % seats for admission of candidates belonging to EWS category. The certificate should be issued on or after 31st March, 2026.

Admission to Supernumerary Seats:

Admission to all supernumerary seats will be through CUET (UG) - 2026. Candidates desirous of taking admission on Supernumerary seats must appear in CUET (UG) - 2026.

Ward Quota:

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must appear in CUET (UG) - 2026.

Admission to the wards of the University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9 (a) & (b) dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments thereof.

Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration. Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.



Guidelines for Admission on the basis of Extra-curricular and Sports Quota (Supernumerary Seats) 2026-27

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET (UG) – 2026.

For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET (UG) score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

The applicants shall be required to produce the following documents in original (hard copy) with two sets of self-attested photocopies at the time of admission:

1. Class X Certificate (Mark-sheet or Certificate) indicating date of birth and Parents' names (The names of applicants claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/KM must match with the names that appear on the corresponding reservation certificates. Similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates).
2. Class XII Marks-Sheet.
3. SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/KM Certificate (in the name of the Applicant) issued by the competent authority. (The names of applicants claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/CW/KM must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates).
4. OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) Certificate (in the name of the Applicant) issued by the competent authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC central list issued by <https://ncbc.nic.in> (The name of the applicant claiming reservation under OBC (Non- Creamy Layer) must match with the applicant's name as it appears on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates. Similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates).
5. EWS Certificate from competent authority certifying the applicant can claim reservation under this category. (The names of applicants claiming reservation under this category must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates. Similarly, their parents' names must match in both sets of certificates).

Self-attested copies of the above mentioned Mark-sheets/Certificates should also be submitted along with the originals. In addition, students are required to bring 4 Passport size photographs to be affixed in the Admission and other Forms.



Maintenance of Discipline

The students are required to observe discipline in the College. As per Ordinance XV-B of the University, the following will constitute breach of discipline:

- a. Physical assault or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi.
- b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons.
- c. Any violation of the provisions of The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1976.
- d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes.
- e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women.
- f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner.
- g. Willful destruction of institutional property.
- h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds.
- i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the College system.
- j. Ragging.

Smoking & Drug Free Zone

Delhi University is partnering with Delhi Police and World Lung Foundation, South Asia in promoting a tobacco and drug consumption free environment. As a step in that direction, smoking and drug is banned in our College.

The College is a Vegetarian and No Alcohol Zone

The College is a vegetarian and no alcohol zone. Eating non-vegetarian food in the College premises is strictly banned. No one is permitted to consume alcohol in the College premises or come to College after consuming alcohol.

Anti Ragging Regulations as per Ordinance XV-C

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
 - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
 - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
 - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College shall take immediate action to any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. In case any student who has obtained degree of Delhi University and is found under this Ordinance committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she may be subjected under statute 15 to appropriate action for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University.

At the time of the admission every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Principal, Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the College/University who may be vested with authority under the Act, the Statutes, the Ordinances and Rules to exercise discipline that have been framed thereunder by the College/University. He/she is expected to honour this commitment in letter and spirit during his/her stay at the College.

In addition to above, students seeking admission in various courses are requested to fill their online Anti Ragging Undertaking on website i.e. <https://antiragging.in>. A hard copy of the final print (Anti Ragging Undertaking) is mandatory to submit in the office after the admission is complete.



Students are advised not to bring outsiders with them inside the College premises. If indulging in activities resulting in indiscipline, the outsider shall be invariably handed over to the Police and strict disciplinary action, even leading to expulsion from the College, shall be taken against the students who bring such an outsider in the College premises.

General Rules

1. **Attendance:** Students must fulfil the Minimum attendance as prescribed under the University rules for lectures, tutorials, preceptorials in each year/semester. The benefit of medical leave will be available only if the required Medical and Fitness Certificates are submitted at the time of joining of the College.
2. **Periodic test/examination/assignments:** Students must appear for all tests whenever scheduled.
3. **Free Periods:** These should be utilized for study in the Reading Room and Library.
4. **Cleanliness:** College premises must be kept free from litter.
5. **Identity Card:** Every student must carry his/her Smart Identity Card at all time and show it immediately when demanded by any member of the College Staff. In case of loss of the Identity Card, a duplicate Identity Card will be issued only on the submission of a copy of F.I.R. and the applicable fine.
6. **Notice Board:** Students must make it a habit to check the Notice Board at least everyday.
7. Any information desired from the office should be sought at the respective counters of the office.
8. Students are expected not to loiter aimlessly or talk loudly in the verandahs while classes are in progress.

They are not to stand in groups in front of the classroom or near the Principal's office.

9. **Staff Room:** Students are not permitted to enter Staff Room without permission of a staff member or to remain standing outside it.
 10. **College Functions:** Students are expected to attend all the college functions.
 11. **Students' Union:** There is a Students' Union in the College which is affiliated to DUSU. Only Students of II and III year are eligible to contest the election for office bearers of the college union provided they have cleared all the papers and secured at least 75% attendance and atleast 40% marks in the University examination in the preceding year.
 12. Students are not allowed to sit on the roundabout in front of the porch.
 13. Any unauthorised person found inside the college campus would be handed over to the police.
- Ignorance of any rule will not be accepted as an excuse.

University Examination

The examination will be held Semester wise as per Undergraduate Curriculum Framework 2022 based on NEP 2020. There will be an examination at the end of each semester.

Internal Assessment (IA)

The Internal Assessment will be conducted as per the applicable University Rules.

A part-time Medical Officer is available in the College. A Psychologist is available on a weekly basis to provide counselling to the students.

Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine

Our College was first among all the Co-ed Colleges of University of Delhi to install sanitary napkin vending machine for females. The machine is installed in the Medical Room.



Library and Reading

Room

1. Hours of Opening:

The Library normally remains open throughout the year from 01.30 p.m. to 8.30 p.m. except on Holidays.

Library hours during the vacation are notified at the beginning of each vacation. Before each Semester Examination, for two months, the Library remains open from 09:00 am to 08:30 PM to meet students' examination requirements.

2. Issue Hours:

(a) General Section: From 3.00 p.m. to 7.45 p.m. (Monday to Friday)

(b) Overnight Books (from the textbooks section) from 7.45 p.m. to 8.15 p.m. (Monday to Friday)

3. Loan Privileges:

Every student of the College will be issued an Identity Card and Reader's Tickets (three for honours courses and two for Programme courses). Books will be lent to borrowers only in exchange of these tickets. These tickets are non-transferable.

4. Conditions of Loan:

Different Categories of books are issued for a period ranging from 1 to 14 days.

**Rules for Refund of Fee on Account of Withdrawal/Cancellation of Admission**

A saving account must be in the name of the applicant. Any payment, whatever it may be, shall be transferred to the Saving Account of the applicant by direct payment system.

Smart I-Card

From the Academic Year (2017-18) Multipurpose (electronic mode) smart identity cards are provided to the students.

College Fees Payable at the Time of Admission

The students are advised to preserve the fee receipt issued by the College. However if it is lost or misplaced a duplicate receipt can be obtained on payment of Rs. 100/-. Foreign Students seeking admission to the College should deposit an amount (as notified by the University) per year on account of foreign students' registration fee in addition to regular fees of the College.

Non-Payment of College Dues

If dues are not paid by the specified date, a late fee will be charged. If dues are not paid by last day of the month mentioned, the name of defaulter will be struck off from the College rolls without giving any notice. The students whose name is thus struck off may, however, be re-admitted by the order of the Principal on Payment of re-admission fee and other dues.

Stipends and Fee-Concession

The College grants freeship and half freeship in free to the needy students and outstanding sportsmen. The continuance of the stipend or concession in the fee depends on good behavior and regular attendance of the student and his/her satisfactory progress in studies. An application for concession should be made on prescribed form available from the College office.
